I have the artwork saved, that way I can add to it. the points of the knot are all the same distance from the edge of the sheet,

Now that I've done this, I'm seeing other people do similar types of stiching on paper designs. I tried sharing my excitement over the circular stitch pattern on paper with another person, and she just poopoo'd the whole thin. Like paint by number. I will say this, I used 100% cotton paper, doesn't that count as fabric.

Sure paint by number is someone else's art that can be bought and painted, much like coloring books, that doesn't lessen the calming experience that a person can gain by a paint by number, or the confidence they gain to try something on their own. Art is something that means something to you, something you can hang in your house, wear, and have fun with. It's not meant to be stressful. Looking back on previous newsletters, I would have to say this happened around July 2022. About the same time I fell and broke my arm. I was on light duty for 8 weeks, no driving. I had a blast.
